The survey produced some interesting results and whilst in the main people like living in the parish, understandably concerns were raised about the amount of development, traffic and lack of community and sporting facilities. Respondents felt the parish was a safe place to live and loved the open space and setting of the parish and this was something that people would like to protect. The responses collected will be used to write the policies and aims and objectives of the Neighbourhood Plan and a vision statement for our parish. A full copy of the presentation and/or report is available from the Parish Council.

The findings from the householder survey can also be used to inform future decisions and policies of the Parish Council and aid applications for grant funding. Making it even more important that you took the time to take part and voice your opinions so thank you again for your contribution.

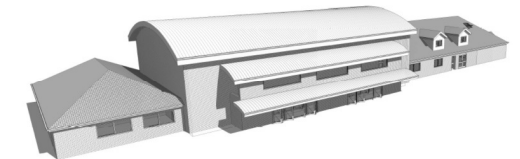

Plans Agreed for the Completion of the Pavilion and Community Centre at Tews Lane

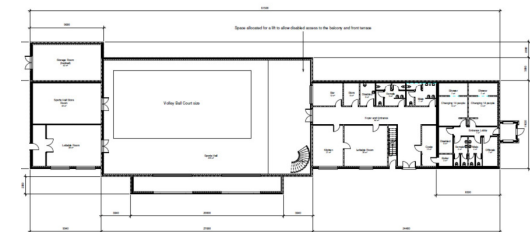
The Tews Lane Committee has recently approved the plans for the completion of the pavilion at the Queen Elizabeth II Sports Fields, Tews Lane. The plans include a sports hall, bar, meeting rooms and accommodation above for a possible caretaker. The Planning Application will be submitted in the near future and there is Section 106 funding coming forward from the developments in the area to complete the project. Section 106 Funding has also been secured for an extension to the existing car parking and a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) on site.
