Members considered the charges for 2018/2019 and it was **resolved**, with no votes to the contrary, to increase the charges in line with inflation and by 3% for 2018/2019.
- 1802/21      **To receive Messrs Gayton, W S Gayton & Son Ltd**  
Mr John Gayton was pleased that any issues with vermin had been dealt with swiftly and thanked the Parish Council. Mr John Gayton explained that the wet weather had made grave digging difficult and any complaints received would be understandable, ply sheets would be used during wet weather to prevent damage to the ground around the grave. It was noted that one complaint had been received.  
  
The Chairman asked Messrs Gayton if anyone attending a funeral at the Cemetery had expressed a difficulty in finding the Cemetery and whether they felt signage was required. Messrs Gayton confirmed that they were not aware of any difficulties in locating the Cemetery but did indicate that a sign by the New Inn would help.  
  
Mr John Gayton indicated that there is a provision of approximately ten years left in the current section of the Cemetery.  
  
Mr David Gayton asked if the Parish Council would consider increasing the non-parishioner rate. It was agreed to place this on the Agenda for consideration next year.
