Two Minute Beach Clean

Fremington Quay is the latest area to join the Two Minute Clean Scheme. Cllr Rodney Cann used his North Devon Council Locality Budget to purchase a board for the Quay to encourage visitors to take a couple of minutes to clear litter and keep the area looking at its best.



The concept was originally conceived in Bude in 2014 and after implementation saw a reduction in litter by 61%, there are now over 250 boards in the UK and Ireland. The 2 Minute Beach Clean Station supports the concept of the Plastic Free Campaign run by North Devon Council which has gained a huge amount of support. The issue of plastic and rubbish polluting our seas and rivers and the need to reduce this pollution has received national recognition recently. If you are visiting Fremington Quay why not give it a try.
